Discussion Questions

- I. Put yourself in the place of the older woman. Touching Jesus was a risky endeavor for her. Describe what her faith must have been like. What must she have thought or understood about Jesus to seek Him out and only touch his garments?
- II. Jesus asked who touched His garments, but certainly already knew. What characteristics does He display here? What do you think He was doing? What would you have felt in that moment if you were the woman who had touched Him?
- III. Now put yourself in the place of Jairus. Imagine watching Jesus, on the way to heal your daughter from the verge of death, stop and ask who touched His robe; and then learn that your daughter has died. What are some areas in your life that cause you to stress and fear that God isn't moving quickly enough, or working according to your timing?
- IV. When it was announced that Jairus' daughter had died, there were voices in the crowd suggesting that Jesus might as well not even go anymore. Have you ever "put Jesus in a box?" In what ways have you ever doubted His abilities or power?
- V. How important is it to you individually that God is "the Divine Task-Master?" What problems arise when we fail to acknowledge that aspect of His nature?

These questions are designed to facilitate further discussion of this morning's topic in small group settings such as K-groups or over dinner with family and friends. We hope you find them helpful to your spiritual growth.

GLIMPSES OF GLORY

Lesson 5: The Divine Multitasker’s Power over Disease and Death (Mark 5:21–43)

The word “daughter” is used to refer to both the older and younger females
Both daughters were initially dying
Both daughters were in a “hopeless” situation
Both daughters were ceremonially unclean
Fear was a part of both scenarios
The number “12” is highly significant in both scenarios

- I. **The raising of the young daughter, Part 1:** The Lord Jesus encountered the synagogue official Jairus with his heartfelt plea to come to his home and restore his young daughter to health—Mark 5:21–24a.
- II. **The healing of the older daughter:** Jesus Christ healed an older woman of a chronic hemorrhage when she appropriated His power through her desperate faith—Mark 5:24b–34.
 - A. The context for His encounter with the older woman was a crowd pressing in on Him—Mark 5:24b.
 - B. Within the crowd was a desperate woman with an intolerable hemorrhage that had persisted for 12 long years—Mark 5:25–26.
 - C. The desperate woman reached out in faith to touch Jesus’ clothing in order to be restored to health—Mark 5:27–28.
 - D. The nearly hopeless woman was immediately healed of her intolerable condition—Mark 5:29.
 - E. Jesus engaged the anxious woman in the crowd and affirmed her faith in Him and His ability to heal her—Mark 5:30–34.
- III. **The raising of the young daughter, Part 2:** The God-man restored the life of Jairus’ little girl in the privacy of her bedroom with her parents and a few of His disciples present—Mark 5:35–43.
 - A. The news of Jairus’ little daughter’s death was publicly announced to him, the Lord Jesus, and the multitude—Mark 5:35–36.
 - B. Jesus quickly traveled to Jairus’ home with His inner circle of three disciples—Mark 5:37.
 - C. The Savior staged His miracle at Jairus’ home by dismissing everyone, but the parents of the little girl and His three disciples—Mark 5:38–40.
 - D. Jesus raised Jairus’ daughter from her deathbed—Mark 5:41–43.
