
Sunday Morning

Discussion Questions

- I. Jesus began by dismissing the crowd—He addressed the distraction before it even became an issue. How have you seen God remove distractions in the past as a way to draw you closer to Himself? In what ways might God be removing distraction from your life right now?
- **II.** After dismissing the crowd, Jesus then went off to pray. How can this model of removing distractions and then praying be implemented into your own life right now? What distractions should you walk away from for a time in order to be with God?
- **III.** Jesus appeared to the disciples by walking on the sea, and showing His authority over many of their superstitions and misplaced beliefs. What myths and superstitions might influence you that would distract you from Biblical truth? How have those superstitions or beliefs caused you to miss the glory of God?
- **IV.** As Peter walked on the water towards Jesus, he was distracted by the wind and the waves, and was afraid. What circumstances—the "wind and waves" in your life—distract you from intimacy with God? What dangers and threats pull your focus off of God and His power over your life?
- V. We see in this passage that the result of God's removal of our distractions is the freedom for us to worship Him—and that distractions and worship cannot co-exist. Why is worship so essential? What makes it our greatest good? And how does this understanding change your outlook on distractions?
